A pharmacogenetic test can be ordered before you start a medication or after you are taking a medication that is not working or is causing side effects.



Understand Your Pharmacogenetic Test Results with a MyRx Virtual Visit

You will meet virtually one-on-one with a specially-trained MyRx pharmacist to:

- Learn about pharmacogenetics
- Review your test results
- Get your test results in an easy-to-understand format
- Learn how your results may impact your current and future medications³
- Ask questions about your pharmacogenetic test results

A copy of your test results and a written summary of your visit with the pharmacist will be sent to your doctor. The summary will explain your pharmacogenetic test results and include medication recommendations. Your doctor can follow up with your MyRx pharmacist to discuss your results. Remember, you shouldn't make any changes to your medications without first talking to your doctor.

A pharmacogenetics virtual visit with MyRx may:

- Give you information about which medications to steer clear of to avoid side effects and those that might not work as well because of your genes
- Help you make informed decisions with your provider about your medications
